
### Honor Council Hearing Activity Loyola University Maryland Annual Report: 2023-2024

# Cases Adjudicated, 2023-2024 Academic Year 67 completed hearings Of these. 10 were repeat violations



The Honor Council adjudicated 67 cases dutine 2023-2024 academic year, including the summer of 2024. While the overall number of cases represents almost 20% increase over academic year 2022-2023, the total is closely sintial the 66 cases adjudited the year prior. The Council had been bracing itself for a mogenisticant increase in the number of cases due to greater availability of AI and AI tools such as a CPT and CoPilot. Even tools that had not been associated with AI in the past, sash Grammarly, have no invegrated artificial intelligence in the assistance they provide.

The Council has begun to record thumber of cases that involve gled use of AI. Last year, 27% of the adjudicated cases had bowith AI use. This yeathat proportion has risen to 52% of the cases.

#### Honor Code Violations by Class Year



The chart above is based on the 64 honor counce stated a finding of "responsible" in the 2023-2024 academic year. First-year stasdeontinue to represent the highest proportion of cases at 45.3%. This year, the number of cases acerning juniors and seniors was more than halved, from 16% at 2.5% last year for juniors asseniors, respectively, to only 7.8% for each class this year. The number asses involving sophomes, however, doubled to 39%.

It is difficult to make generaliations based on such a small sansize. For example, of the 25 sophomore cases that were adjuted at en were from one course.

The cases that involved AI this past academia were all classified as cheating (involving the unauthorized use of assistance in the completicance signment), pragiarism (passing off materials "written" by the AI tool as one's own).


The Honor Council has integrated more discussif the use of AI and the prevention of cheating in its presentations to first-year Messilasses and in the Acerdic Integrity Tutorial, which is required of all icoming undergraduate students.

Types of Violations Adjudicated

take-home exams and papers, or assignment so perceptite ratively, such as workshopped papers, may be contributing to few reports of violations.

On the other hand, it is also posser that faculty reporting is descarsing. Accusations related to improper use of AI, for example, are often movemplex and less straightforward to identify than some other instances of plagiarism, sauschopying a paragraphom a published source.
